Applications are invited for a full-time Research Associate/Research Assistant to lead a five-year longitudinal project investigating auditory processing abilities and language development in infants. The position is available from 1 September 2016 or as soon as possible thereafter until 31 August 2021.

Applicants should ideally have a PhD in psychology, engineering, neuroscience, linguistics or related disciplines (or be close to completion), and experience of designing, administering and analysing EEG experiments with infants. Expertise in oscillatory paradigms and time-frequency analyses would be an advantage. They require excellent mathematical, programming and technical skills (e.g. Matlab).

Applicants will require the capacity to work independently running EEG studies with infants and analysing data.

The salary range if appointed as a Research Associate is £28,982 - £37,768 per annum and the salary range if appointed as Research Assistant is £25,023 - £28,982 per annum with promotion to Research Associate on attainment of PhD.
